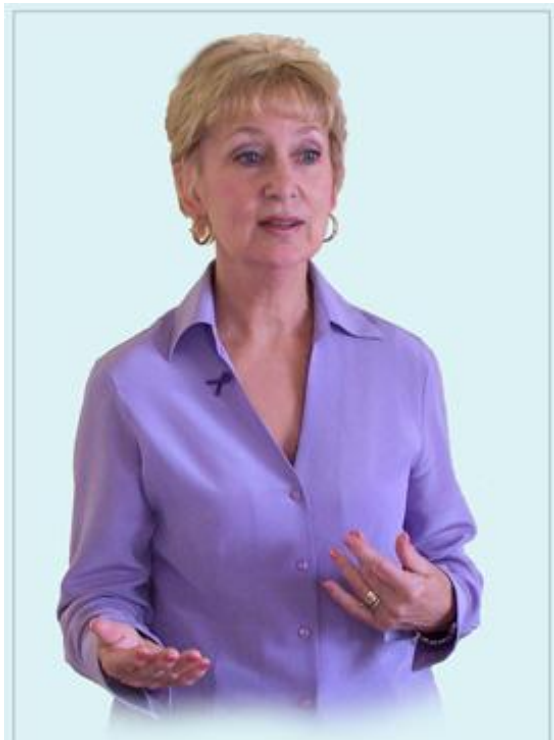

### ***PAUL HENRY, AUTHOR AND SAFETY EXPERT***

Paul is the author of *'FEARLESS: The Complete Personal Safety Guide for Women'*. He has also written numerous articles on personal safety, which have appeared in major women's magazines and police journals. Paul is the program director of the White Tiger Group – an organization that travels to schools across the nation teaching personal safety skills to women and girls.

He holds a university degree in sociology and education, and a post graduate degree in adult education from Concordia University in Montreal Canada. His safety advice has been featured in major publications like the Chicago Tribune, Toronto Star and Phoenix's Arizona Republic. He has been a guest safety consultant for NBC television in New York providing personal safety advice for shows such as "The John Walsh Show" and "Dateline"

In Arizona, Paul has been a guest safety lecturer at Arizona State University, Central Arizona College in Casa Grande, Arizona Western College in Yuma, Gateway Community College in Phoenix and Westwood High School in Mesa. He has delivered keynote presentations at major conferences including the School Nurses Organization of Arizona's Annual Conference in Sedona and the Girl Scouts of America Product Convention in Phoenix

Paul has also delivered public safety workshops in collaboration with recreation departments in Yuma, Buckeye, and Camp Verde as well as with other county agencies such as Maricopa County Library System, Mohave County Library System, and the Sedona Public Library. He has been certified by the New York State Crime Prevention Coalition as Crime prevention Specialist.

### ***JESSICA, SURVIVOR AND WOMEN'S SELF-DEFENSE INSTRUCTOR***

Jessica met her boyfriend in high school. She moved in with him at the young age of 16. Learn how Jessica was able to find the strength and courage to leave her abuser. Jessica is now in her final year of Teacher's College and works to empower young women by teaching girls self-defense.

### ***LINDA KING, FIX THE HURT***

Linda King and her husband John have been through a parent's worst nightmare...the loss of a child. Not just one, but three. John lost a son, the result of a car accident, and a daughter, the result of violent criminal act.

Then John and Linda lost a daughter, Lisa, to an act of domestic violence. It was this third loss that caused Linda to step forward. With quiet assertiveness, and a calm, yet passionate voice, Linda began to speak out against Domestic Violence. A voice that clearly defined what Domestic Violence is, told of the warning signs and what victims, their families and the community could do to help protect those being abused, and make Abusers accountable.

Beginning in 2002, while serving on the Board of Directors for MADD and the Coalition for the Homeless, in El Paso, Texas. She started speaking to thousands of high school and middle school students about dating and domestic violence. Then Commanding Officers at Fort Bliss had her speak to the soldiers stationed there. UTEP (the University of Texas at El Paso) asked her to be the keynote speaker for their "Take Back the Night" program.

She spoke to various Law Enforcement organizations and trained volunteers for the Center Against Family Violence in El Paso.

Later that year, Linda's unselfish and tireless efforts were recognized when she received the REACH Award from the El Paso YWCA for Community Service. Her work received recognition again in 2003 when she was awarded the First Annual Meridian Leadership Award from Meridian Magazine. And she was recognized again in 2006 when she received the Help, Hope and Healing Award from the City Of El Paso's District Attorney's Office.

Now Linda and her husband make Mesa, Arizona their home, and just as she did in El Paso, with the same calm, yet passionate voice, she speaks out against Domestic Violence. ### **"Welcome to the Party" by Kayla Fulmer, AzSAN, Arizona Sexual Assault Network**

A viewing of the poignant film "Welcome to the Party" will review three modern scenarios on how perpetrators of sexual violence think and operate. These all too real scenarios depict the risks and outcomes of youth, alcohol, and peer pressure, and display the powerful need for increased education and awareness to reduce the risk of sexual assault among these young populations. Following the film, Teri Lambert will lead a discussion and presentation on the realities portrayed in the film, as well as offer tips and suggestions for how to prevent this violence from happening. In addition, resources for prevention as well as victim services will be highlighted and provided.

Before becoming the Executive Director of AzSAN, Teri Lambert had been working and volunteering in the field of violence against women since 1999. As a survivor of both domestic violence and sexual assault, Teri initially sought to serve in this field as a volunteer board member and president of the Catholic Community Services Safe House Advisory Board. In 2001 Teri was hired as the Domestic Violence Paralegal for the Yuma County Attorney's Office. During her 8 year tenure, she assisted in hundreds of major and minor D.V. cases, organized a week long prevention program for junior and senior high schools, participated in organizing statewide conferences and activities, and provided local law enforcement training. Teri then became the AWC/NAU-Yuma Violence Prevention Program Coordinator, which is a Dept. of Justice O.V.W. Campus Grant funded program. While there, Teri organized and conducted statewide, countywide and campus trainings, providing trainings and presentations to hundreds of students, law enforcement and advocates. Sponsored by the Pinal County Law Enforcement Association, Teri provided a one day V.A.W. training for law enforcement, prosecution and advocates as an independent consultant for AzPOST. Teri is one semester away from obtaining her Master's Degree in Community Counseling from NAU and served her practicum hours at Catholic Community Services counseling trauma victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and homicide survivors. She had begun an internship with Chicanos Por La Causa before taking her current position with AzSAN [www.arizonasexualassaultnetwork.org](http://www.arizonasexualassaultnetwork.org)

### **AMBER NORGAARD, SINGER-SONGWRITER**

**Amber** often has audience members stunned at how such a big voice and dynamic energy can come out of such a petite artist. In Arizona, she's described as "truly a great songwriter and performer." Armed with the confidence of recently being a semi-finalist in the Alaska Public Radio Song of the Year Contest, she put her music to disc and hit the ground running with the release of her debut album *SOUL IN MOTION* in July 2004.
